Sport @ ECiM

Boys' Rugby with KL Tigers

A team sport that delivers significant social and health benefits. It can also be a physically demanding sport and players should be physically and mentally prepared, and understand how to play safely.

Girls' Rugby

A sport identical to Boys' rugby with the same rules, same sized pitch, and same equipment. ECiM girls will get an opportunity to play touch rugby or contact depending on their preference.

Girls' Netball

An exciting, fast and skillful game of fair contest, played by two teams of seven players. Its development, derived from early versions of basketball, began in England in the 1890s. A chance for newcomers to develop skills and work as a team, and also a separate opportunity for the school squad to get together and perfect their game.

Athletics

A collection of sporting events that involve competitive running, jumping, throwing, and walking.

A racket sport that can be played individually against a single opponent (singles) or between two teams of two players each (doubles).

Table Tennis

Also known as ping-pong, is a sport in which two or four players hit a lightweight ball back and forth across a table using small bats. The game takes place on a hard table divided by a net.

Swimming

Competitive swimming is one of the most popular Olympic sports, with varied distance events in butterfly, backstroke, breaststroke, freestyle, and individual medley. This term there will be opportunities for recreational swimming and separate training sessions for the swim squad.

Basketball

Basketball is a handball game usually played by two teams of five players on a court. The objective is to get the ball through a hoop mounted high on a backboard at back end.

Squash

A ball sport played by two (singles) or four players (doubles squash) in a four-walled court with a small, hollow rubber ball.

Hockey

A sport in which two teams play against each other by trying to maneuver a ball or a puck into the opponent's goal using a hockey stick.

Golf (FEE RM500 per term)

A club-and-ball sport in which players use various clubs to hit balls into a series of holes on a course in as few strokes as possible.

Badminton

A sport played by volleying a shuttlecock back and forth over a high narrow net by means of a light, long-handled racket.


Volleyball

A team sport in which two teams of six players are separated by a net. Each team tries to score points by grounding a ball on the other team's court under organized rules. It has been a part of the official program of the Summer Olympic Games since 1964

Theatresports Club

This club challenges points of view and expresses opinions. It creates an evening of theatre that engages the audience in a way that makes them respond openly, as one might do at a sporting event, and has them thinking and talking about the performance afterwards.

Individual, Pair and Group options available for EAL as well as junior students at Grades 1 to 5, and Senior Students at Grade 6, 7 and 8 all of which gain UCAS points similar to Extended Project Qualifications and A levels. 

The purpose of this programme is to provide the opportunity for all students to develop appropriate skills in their mother tongue.




KS3 Communication & Computer Coding

An opportunity for Day Students to utilise their time in school and work on prep, coursework and exam preparation.


No-Cook Cooking
